
This winter, 28 NJ 4-H youth delegates traveled to the Washington DC metro area for the National 4-H Youth Agri-Science Summit to develop skills and knowledge to address issues in agriculture. food security, and sustainability. The Summit was an engaging learning and networking opportunity for the youth delegates from various regions of the state, including four youth from Hudson County. This experience highlighted the many ways that agriculture and food systems is relevant in their lives and how it impacts their communities. In addition to hearing keynote speakers, attending workshops, and meeting youth from across the country, the youth delegates created a community action plan focused on pollinator habitats to engage their peers and communities.


